

The Board of County Commissioners RESOLUTION

- WHEREAS, Samuel "Sammy" Benjamin Watkins IV was born in Fort Myers, Florida on June 14, 1993 and attended South Fort Myers High School where he was a varsity athlete in football, basketball and track & field. He became the all-time leading receiver in the history of Lee County and led an undefeated South Fort Myers team into the 3A state semifinals; and
- WHEREAS, In 2010 Sammy committed to attend Clemson University where he was an AP first-team All-American his freshman year, becoming only the fourth ever true freshman to do so. In his sophomore year he accumulated 708 yards, 58 receptions, and three touchdowns and as a junior he was the MVP of the 2014 Orange Bowl after setting a record with 16 receptions for 227 yards; and
- WHEREAS, In 2014 Sammy Watkins was drafted in the first round as the fourth overall pick in the 2014 NFL Draft by the Buffalo Bills, his favorite childhood team and set a new rookie record in both receptions and receiving yards. During his tenure with the Buffalo Bills, Sammy was listed as one of the Top 100 Players of 2016; and
- WHEREAS, On February 2nd 2020, Sammy Watkins became a Super Bowl champion by helping the Kansas City Chiefs defeat the San Francisco 49ers with five catches for 98 yards including a critical 38-yard grab to set up the go-ahead touchdown late in the fourth quarter;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE Board of County Commissioners of Lee County, Florida proclaims February 18th as
